Tickets on Sale for the 2026 CAA Men's and Women's Swimming & Diving Championships

Hampton, VA – Advance tickets are now on sale for the 2026 CAA Men's and Women's Swimming & Diving Championships, which will be held February 25 - February 28, 2026 at the Hampton Virginia Aquaplex in Hampton, Va.

All-session ticket books purchased online are \$100 for adults and \$45 for children (ages 2-12), which includes access to all seven sessions of the Championships. Individual session tickets are also available in advance and cost \$18 for adults and \$8 for children.

Ticket books purchased online can be picked up at will-call with a valid ID or printed receipt. Presale online ticket sales are [available here](#), and will remain on sale until Monday, February 23, 2026 at 12:00 p.m. noon.

All-session tickets will also be on sale at the door starting Wednesday, February 25, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. for adults for \$110 and children (ages 2-12) for \$50. Individual sessions are \$18 for adults and \$7 for children (ages 2-12). College students presenting a valid school ID will receive FREE admittance.

Parents who are working as timers should only purchase tickets for those sessions they are NOT timing. It is recommended for parents to purchase those tickets on-site.

Please note that cash will NOT be accepted for any onsite ticket or merchandise sales, so we ask that you plan accordingly and provide either a credit or debit card.
