**Tuskegee Airmen Inc. seeks volunteers to assemble care packages for our
Armed Services**

Hampton, VA - The Tidewater Chapter, Tuskegee Airmen Inc. in conjunction with Diageo North America will host a 'Purple Bag Packing Event' at the Rupert Sargent Building located at 1 Franklin Street, Hampton on November 9 from 3-6 p.m. The Purple Bag Packing Event is an annual event where volunteers assemble care packages for soldiers deployed overseas.

This year the Tidewater Chapter, Tuskegee Airmen Inc. graciously accepted the offer to pack the packages for the nation's deployed warriors. The Hampton site is one of five chosen in North America and has been requested to package 1,000 'Purple Bags.' Once the packages are completed, one of Diageo's external partners will collect and distribute the packages to locations overseas.

The national mission of the organization is to focus on honoring the accomplishments and perpetuating the history of African Americans who participated in air crew, ground crew and operations support training in the Army Air Corps during WWII. Additionally, the Tidewater Chapter's mission is to perpetuate the legacy of the Tuskegee Airmen by inspiring youth to strive for excellence through educational opportunities.
